Learning objectives:

- ❖ Understand the principles that underpin the National Care Standards and how these are applied in practice in care home settings
- ❖ Reflect upon their practice and promote the importance of providing dignified person-centred care which upholds the human rights of care home residents
- ❖ Be more informed about dementia and how to support people with dementia in care home settings.
- ❖ Demonstrate an understanding of the Adult Support and Protection (Scotland) Act 2007 and its role in supporting and protecting "Adults at Risk" of harm and neglect in care home settings
- ❖ Understand the **3 point test** known or believed for a person to be an "Adult at Risk" under the Adult Support and Protection (Scotland) Act 2007
- ❖ Recognise the different forms of harm and neglect in care home settings and warning signs/effects on care home residents
- ❖ Clearly describe their duty of co-operation to make Adult Support and Protection referrals to the social work department and share information regarding "Adults at Risk" of harm in care home settings
- ❖ Clearly describe their duty of co-operation during an Adult Support and Protection inquiry/investigation process
- ❖ Recognise when to seek appropriate professional advice and guidance in relation to Adult Support and Protection concerns and where to find this in the Scottish Borders
- ❖ Know how to make an Adult Support and Protection referral to Scottish Borders Council social work department
- ❖ Understand what is meant by raising concerns/"whistleblowing".
